ABOUT THE TRANSMITTER



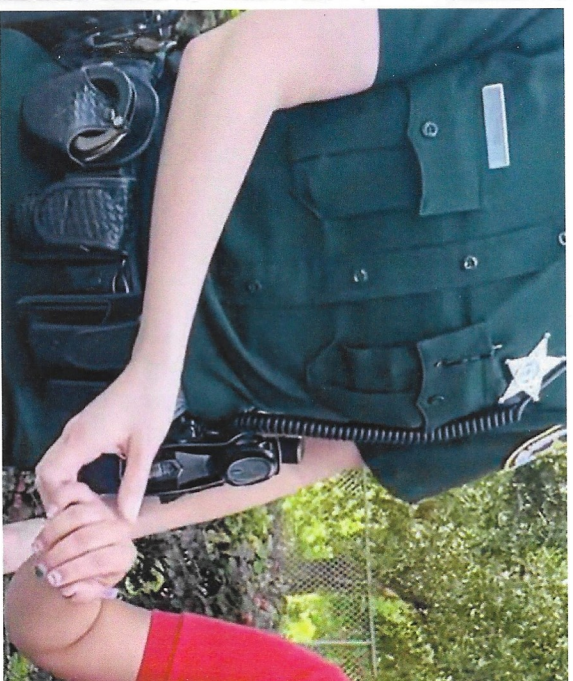
- 1. Battery-powered Bracelet
- 2. Weighs about one ounce
- 3. Emits a radio-tracking signal 24 hours a day
- 4. Battery life lasts 60 to 90 days



RAPID RESPONSE

The Project Lifesaver program was developed in 1999. The Osceola County Sheriff's Office can respond rapidly in the event that the client becomes missing.

The average rescue time remains under 30 minutes. With Project Lifesaver equipment thousands of lives have been saved.



WHO QUALIFIES FOR THE PROGRAM?

- ✓ Applicant must be a resident of Osceola County.
- ✓ Have been diagnosed with some form of cognitive impairment or condition. (Alzheimer's, Dementia, Autism, Down Syndrome, Traumatic Brain Injury)
- ✓ Have a history of or show behaviors that may lead to a propensity to wander, elope, or both.
- ✓ Remain under 24/7 individual supervision by a caregiver.
- ✓ Shall not operate a motor vehicle.

 The goal of the Sheriff's Office is to keep this program cost free for clients.

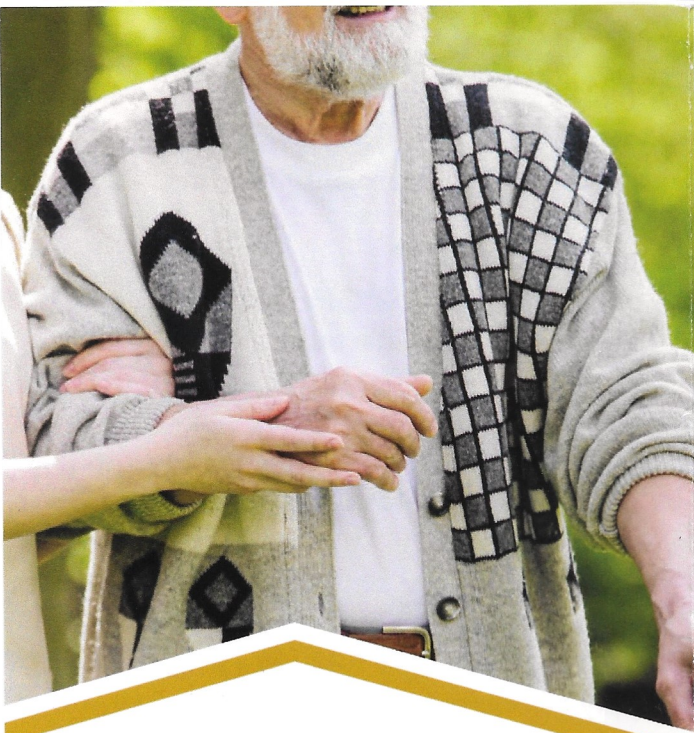
Who will supply replacement batteries and bracelets?

PROJECT LIFESAVER

Project Lifesaver's mission is to use state of the art technology to find persons with cognitive disorders who wander and become lost.

A lost person with a cognitive disorder represents a critical emergency. They are often unaware of their situation. They may not call out for help and sometimes do not respond to people calling out to them.

Project Lifesaver consists of a bracelet with a radio frequency device. This aids the Sheriff's Office search specialist with locating the client in the event they become lost.

This program can help ease the concern of caregivers who are trying to cope with wandering behaviors.

It is the Sheriff's Office initiative to keep this program cost free for all clients.
